Cactus UniView wins major export order for Traffic Management Systems in Denmark

Cactus UniView has signed an agreement with Banedanmark to develop and deliver traffic management systems to Aalborg and the accompanying line between Frederikshavn-Aalborg.

The project will begin immediately, with system start-up planned for early 2012. The agreement also includes an option for Banedanmark to order further deliveries for the systems in Herning and Viborg. Along with the stations around Aalborg, this could mean that Cactus UniView controls a significant percentage of the railway traffic in northern Jutland.

Traffic Management System – Made in Mölndal

Cactus UniView delivered its first traffic management system back in 1993, for StorStockholms Lokaltrafik and Roslagsbanan. Since then there have also been deliveries for the city's Tvärbanan, Saltsjö and Lidingö Lines. In 2005 systems were delivered to Lokalbaneln for six railways in Zealand, and 2009 saw a breakthrough order for the Swedish Transport Administration and the Haparanda Line.

“This is a further prestigious order we have won in competition with major international players. The Nordic railway market is facing some large investment over the next 15 years, and we’re involved from the start. It looks as though our Railway business area will have plenty to do,” says Fredrik Bergström, CEO of Cactus UniView.

Swedish systems expertise strong internationally

Winning large orders for the Swedish Transport Administration and Banedanmark within two years has attracted attention in the industry. Along with Stockholm Transport and Hovedstadens Lokalbaneln, Cactus UniView has a solid platform in the railway sector.

“We have consciously chosen to focus on Denmark in our export endeavours. This is because it is one of the most exciting countries in Europe, with extensive modernisation programmes in signalling technology. The infrastructure owners have also shown great openness and professionalism when it comes to choosing suppliers,” says Jan Andreasson, project manager and Business Area Manager for Railway at Cactus UniView.
